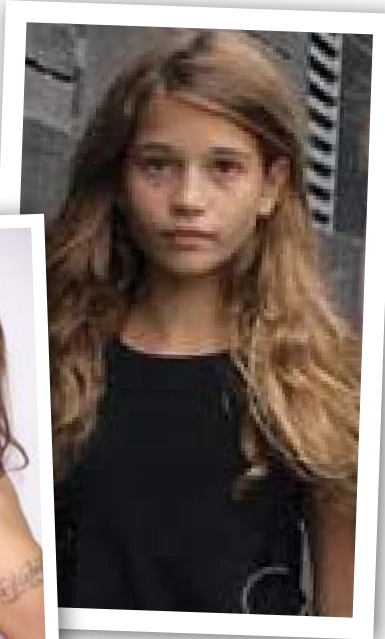
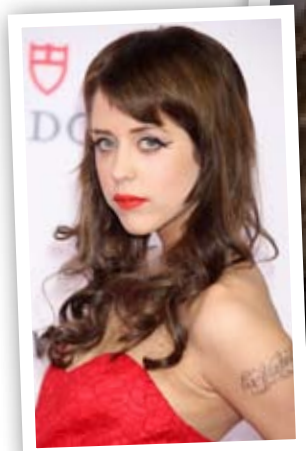

'Several castmembers have come in with garbage bags full of their own clothing asking me to donate it to the kids,' Simone says. 'It's amazing, and they've bent over backwards to help.'

These generous gestures have resulted in packed suitcases of toys and clothes.

'Steve Bastoni came to the studio with a massive bag of his son's toys,' she says. 'He said: "My son's got too many toys – take these.''

'And Stefan Dennis brought bags of baby clothing from his sons, too. It's just gorgeous and the whole cast has been really supportive.'
